REGISTRATION: INFORMATION FOR PRINCIPALS AND TEACHER LEADERS

Becoming eligible for Mighty Peace Day

Every student registered in **grades 5-12** for the 2018-2019 school year in the greater Mighty Peace area is potentially eligible to attend **Mighty Peace Day (MPD) on Tuesday, May 07, 2019** once the following **criteria** are fulfilled:

1. **Participate** in **one local social action project OR one global or national social action project** within the 18 months prior to May 07, 2019. This engagement can be of any nature: fundraising, volunteering, building awareness, etc. Once these criteria are fulfilled, the student is eligible for attendance and needs to be registered by the student's school. **Registration is on a first come, first served basis.**

Registering Students for Mighty Peace Day

Students can **only** be registered by the school **principal or designate** through [Mighty Peace Day website](#). Students can be registered through [School login](#) tab. Each **principal** will receive a **school access code** via email. If your school attended MPD 2017, the **school access code** is the same. Registration for participants is on a **first come, first serve basis** for those who meet the above criteria. It is up to the school to ensure that students registered have met the criteria for attendance. Teachers and others who are attending as supervisors must also be registered. **The last day for online registrations is Monday, April 29th, 2019.** If you are having any difficulty with any aspect of school login or registration, please through the [contact us](#) page on

Supervision of Students at Mighty Peace Day

Schools are asked to please follow their school/district policies regarding student to supervisor ratios for school field trips. All students must remain in their assigned seating area with their supervisors. The venue is a closed venue, that is, **only students, supervisors and volunteers who are registered for MPD will be allowed in the venue**. Students will not be allowed to leave the building during the event for lunch or any other purpose.

Transporting Students to Mighty Peace Day

It is up to schools and school districts to provide transportation to Mighty Peace Day. Students must come with their school and not individually. Special bussing lanes and bussing procedures will be in place to ensure a smooth process when busses arrive at and depart from the Revolution Place.

Provisions for Lunch

Students are asked to bring a bagged lunch to MPD 2019. No students will be leaving the building to purchase lunch. No lunches from outside vendors may be brought into the facility. No food will be available for purchase inside Revolution Place during MPD

Seating at MPD

Since registration is first come, first served, **seating will be assigned** on first come, first served basis as well. As student/school registration comes to completion, school principals will be informed of the section and range of seats allotted to their group. Prior to the event day, an **admittance bracelet** will be forwarded to the schools for each student/supervisor registered. School groups are to sit in areas assigned – these areas will be colour-coded. Volunteers will be on hand to assist with seating.

TALK: Talk to those in your school and community who have a **passion for social justice, for student leadership, for community involvement**. Does your school have a Student Leadership Team, a Social Justice Committee, a Student Council, etc? Get the student group and their teacher leaders to take the lead for your school.

SEND: Send out a one page information page home with your students or place one in your school's electronic newsletter. There is a sample Newsletter insert that you are welcome to use to communicate the information regarding Mighty Peace Day and get your school community's support.

HOST: Host a kick-off event. Pick something fun and engaging to get the students involved. It can be small: Break the Rules day, for example, is a great hit with students! It can be bigger: Engage in a WE Care campaign – see [WE.org](#) for tons of ideas. See the Schools of Action Guide- perhaps even a school level mini-We Day is a possibility for your school.

ASK: Ask your Parent Council and Community Groups to help you out! Will the Parent Council assist with organizing an activity? Can a member of a group like the [Rotary Club](#) talk to the students about the importance of involvement and action? Can you access any funds say for bussing to the MPD event if you are outside of Grande Prairie?
